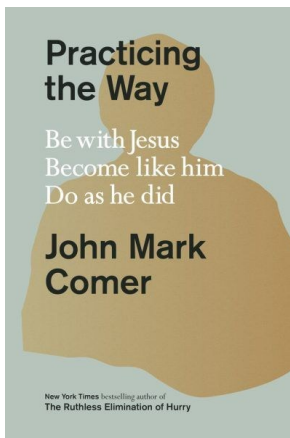
A course in Spiritual Formation!

Session 6— Healing From Sin

Mattew invited Jesus and his disciples to his home as dinner guests, along with many tax collectors and other disreputable sinners. (There were many people of this kind among Jesus' followers.) But when the teachers of religious law who were Pharisees saw him eating with tax collectors and other sinners, they asked his disciples, "Why does he eat with such scum?"

When Jesus heard this, he told them, "Healthy people don't need a doctor—sick people do. I have come to call not those who think they are righteous, but those who know they are sinners." Mark 2:15-17

Jesus once said, "It is not the healthy who need a doctor, but the sick. I have not come to call the righteous, but sinners." He likened sin to a disease and himself to a healer. Based on this text, ancient Christians called Jesus "the doctor of the soul." And trying to go on the spiritual journey of discipleship without healing from sin is like trying to run a marathon with a broken leg — you're not going to get very far, and it's not going to be fun.
