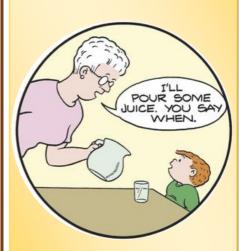

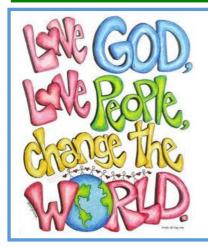

Lord, today I am praying for people who think little of themselves

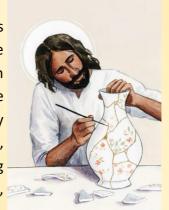

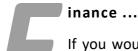
