Home Mission:

In the newssheet of the 7th June, I attempted to outline a little of the background to the formation of the charity we now know as Home Mission and finished by outlining what the charity is primarily seeking to do in the 21st century. There are numerous amazing stories of what Home Mission has been able to do both with regard to new churches being established as well as provision of much-needed funds to enable both new and the fellowships of some smaller existing churches to pay a stipend to a minister.

Our church celebrated its 50th Anniversary in 1990 but at the beginning in 1940 it received a variety of gifts including a donation from Home Mission. I believe I'm right in saying that what became known as Deepwater Baptist Church was originally called Hayesford Park Baptist Church and was, itself the recipient of Home Mission Funding when it first opened its doors. Our friends from that church now form an important part of our fellowship at Coney Hill today.

In closing it's important to emphasise that the Home Mission fund is supported solely by Baptist churches and individual Baptists there being no other financial support from any other organisations.
